**Mr. Reginald Turner**

Reginald Turner began his distinguished law career as a clerk for Michigan Supreme Court Justice Dennis Archer. In 2003, Governor Jennifer Granholm appointed Turner to the Michigan State Board of Education and was elected to a full term in 2006. Turner has served a term as President of the State Bar of Michigan, and is now partner and executive committee member in the Clark Hill law firm. Turner often engages in pro bono representation in important civil rights and liberties cases. He was counsel in the historic affirmative action case involving the University of Michigan, representing a coalition of civil rights organizations and seventeen African American and Latino students. Mr. Turner served for ten years as the Steering Committee co-chair with for the Medical-Educational-Legal-Law Enforcement Team Program, an anti-drug and violence-prevention initiative that mentored over 5,000 children each year.

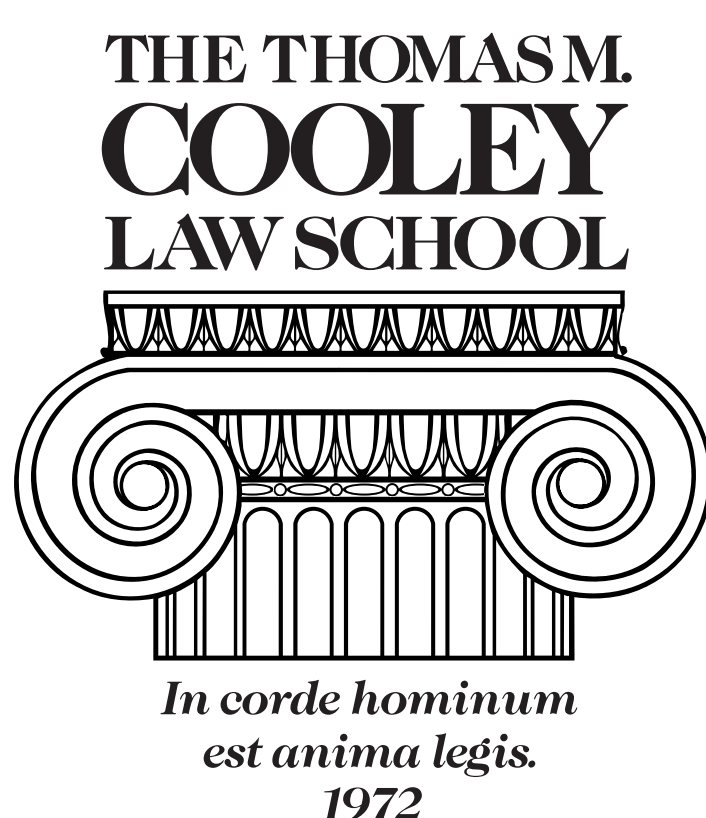
