

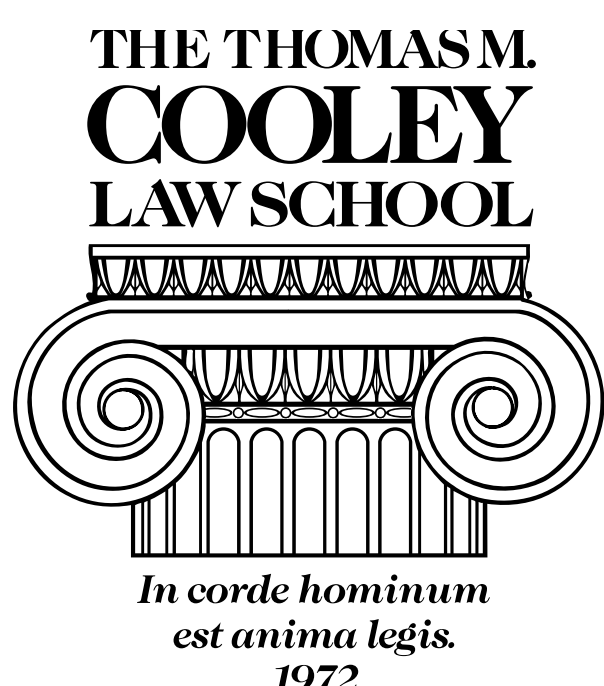

Ms. Craft received her law degree, cum laude, from Cooley while working full time for the Michigan Speaker of the House of Representatives. Following law school and a brief career at the Michigan Consumer's Council, she went to work for Legal Aid of West Michigan. For five years, Ms. Craft represented indigent clients in a variety of civil legal matters. Following her legal aid years, she became a managing attorney at one of the largest law firms in the country, the UAW-GM Legal Services plan. All clients were hourly GM employees. The firm provided personal legal services in a number of areas including representation in real estate, family law, estate planning, probate, consumer issues and bankruptcy. She started her own law firm in 1990.
