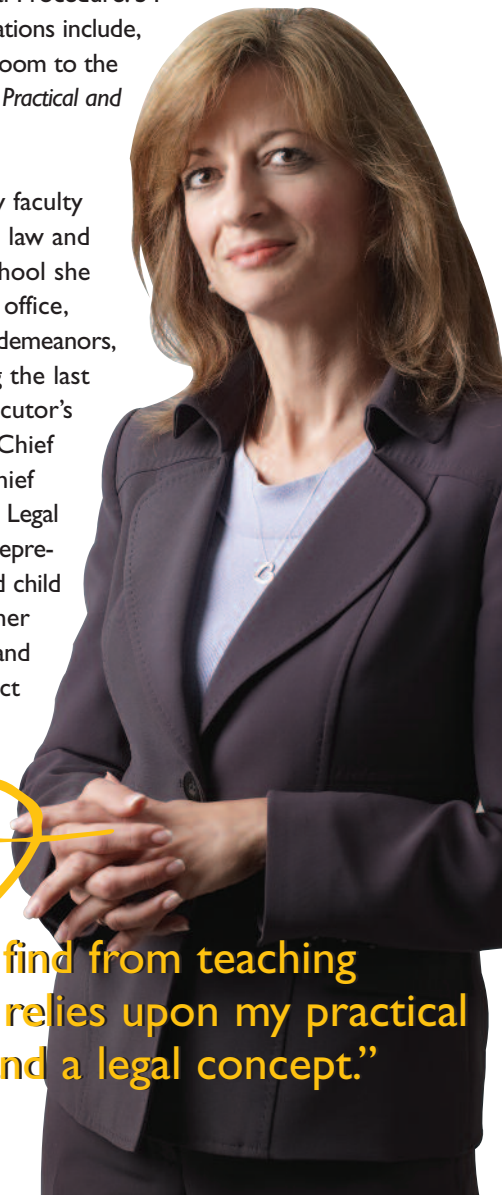


Lisa K. Halushka

Professor Halushka's most recent publications are "Can an Unreasonable Delay in the Presentment Lead to the Suppression of a Confession?" 36 *Preview U.S. S. Ct. Cases* 252 (2009), "Does the Good Faith Exception to the Exclusionary Rule Apply to Police Error?" 36 *Preview U.S. S. Ct. Cases* 23 (2008) and 2006-2007 Survey of Michigan Criminal Procedure. 54 *Wayne L. Rev.* 129 (2008). Upcoming publications include, "The Prosecutor Externship - From Classroom to the Courtroom," 12 *Thomas M. Cooley Journal of Practical and Clinical Law*, (2009).

Professor Halushka comes to the Cooley faculty with an extensive background in criminal law and procedure. Upon graduation from law school she joined the Oakland County Prosecutor's office, where she served 11 years prosecuting misdemeanors, delinquency offenses and felonies. During the last three years of her tenure with the prosecutor's office she served as its Juvenile Division Chief Attorney. Most recently she served as Chief Counsel of the Juvenile Law Group for the Legal Aid and Defender Association of Detroit, representing children in misdemeanor, felony and child abuse offenses. The substantive focus of her work has been in the area of criminal law and juvenile law, specifically child abuse, neglect and delinquency.

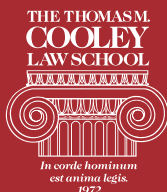

BACKGROUND

PROFESSOR HALUSHKA LECTURED THROUGHOUT THE STATE ON ISSUES CONCERNING JUVENILE DELINQUENCY AND NEGLECT. SHE HAS TRAINED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ON CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ISSUES AND ON YOUTH GANG ACTIVITY AND PROVIDED CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION FOR ATTORNEYS PRACTICING JUVENILE OR CRIMINAL LAW. THE MICHIGAN LAWYER'S WEEKLY NAMED PROFESSOR HALUSHKA AS ONE OF ITS TOP 10 LAWYERS IN MICHIGAN FOR THE YEAR 2000, FOLLOWING HER SUCCESSFUL MURDER PROSECUTION IN *PEOPLE V ABRAHAM*. SHE HAS APPEARED NUMEROUS TIMES AS A JUVENILE AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE EXPERT ON CNN, MSNBC AND FOX NEWS CHANNELS. PROFESSOR HALUSHKA HAS AUTHORED ARTICLES ON ISSUES INVOLVING CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE IN PUBLICATIONS INCLUDING THE WAYNE LAW REVIEW AND THE THOMAS M. COOLEY JOURNAL OF PRACTICAL AND CLINICAL LAW. SHE IS A FREQUENT AUTHOR ON CRIMINAL PROCEDURE TOPICS FOR THE AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION'S PREVIEW OF SUPREME COURT CASES, AND IS THE CONTRIBUTING EDITOR FOR FOURTH AMENDMENT ISSUES FOR THAT PUBLICATION.

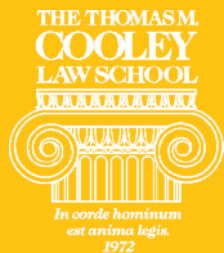
